Three Year Under-Graduate (TYUG) General Programme is of 2500 Marks in Six Semesters. Compulsory Courses are:

i) AEC (Ability Enhancement Course) which includes- (1&3 MIL Bengali, Alt. English).

AEC (2&4 Sem.) – English Language.

ii) EVS (Environmental Studies) – one paper in second semester.

- iii) Language paper General English/Arabic Bengali one paper in First, Second & 3rd Semesters.
- iv) A total of 16 DSC (Discipline Specific Course) papers viz. DSC- 101, 102, 151, 152, 201, 202, 251, 252, 253, 301, 302, 303, 351, 352, 353, 354 to be opted.

Students those who will be duly progressed to 4th year as per guideline of NEP 2020, they will have to opt five more papers viz. 401,402,403,404,451 in the last two semesters i.e. 7th & 8th semester.

- v) A total 8 DSM (Discipline Specific Minor) papers viz. DSM-101, 151,201,251,252,301,302,351 to be opted in the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th Semester.
 - Students those who will be duly progressed to 4th year as per guideline of NEP 2020, they will have to opt two more papers viz., DSM-401, 451 in the last two semesters i.e. 7th, 8th semester respectively.
- vi) Interdisciplinary Courses (IDC)-has three baskets-viz.
 - a) Natural Science- Mathematics, EVSc.
 - b) Social Science (Pol-Sc., Economics, History, Sociology),
 - c) Humanities (Bengali, Arabic, English) one paper in 1st, 2nd & 3rd Semester to be opted.
- vii) Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) one Paper in 1st, 2nd and 3rd Semesters.

Common Value Added Course (VAC) – one paper in 1st Semester. The college has planned to continue NSS Courses for the upcoming session.

Efforts are on to introduce NCC, sports, HW in VAC at the earliest. One more paper on VAC viz., VAC-151 in EVS to be opted in the 2^{nd} Semester.

Internship with industries/Community Engagement/Field Study is a course of study to be opted in the 5th semester.

IMPORTANT GUIDELINES FOR STUDENTS

- 1) Evaluation of 3 and 4 credits courses shall be out of 100 marks and that for 2 credit courses shall be out of 50 marks.
- 2) For AEC courses, there shall not be any internal examination. Total marks for AEC exam. shall be 50 marks with 2 hours duration of examination.
- 3) Excepting AEC for all other courses evaluation method shall be of 70 marks (for End Semester Exam.) and 30 marks (for Internal Exam.). Marks for Internal test shall again be divided to 20 for written test and 10 for attendance.
- 4) In lieu of MIL (Bengali), Alternative English may be opted by a student.
- 5) Any student interested to opt for Honours with Research should have 7.5 CGPA upto third year without any arrear.

No CGPA restriction to move to 4th year for obtaining Honours Degree.

- A. Total credit calculation=120 for TYUG Programme DSC-60, IDC-9, AEC-8, SEC-9, Internship-2, VAC-6, DSM-26
- B. Total credit calculation=160 for FYUG Programme-DSC-80, IDC-9, AEC-8, SEC-9, Internship-2, VAC-6, DSM-34, Project/Dissertation/Additional 03 Courses DSC-12.
- 6. Students shall take two subjects from DSM related to his/her discipline, one as the first minor subject and other as the second minor subject. It is decided that DSM 101, DSM-201, DSM-251 and DSM-301 should be the first minor subject for Three Year Undergraduate Programme and DSM-151, DSM-252, DSM-302 and DSM-351 should be the second minor subject. And for FYUG Programme DSM-401 should be first Minor subject and DSM 541 should the second minor subject.

Different Components and distribution of Marks for Continuous and comprehensive assessment (CCA)

Full Marks & pass Marks for CC (Unit Test + Attendance) Course with only Theory papers:

Full Marks= (Unit Test: 20 + Attendance: 10) = 30 (Thirty).

Pass Marks = 12 (Twelve)

Course with both Theory & practical papers:

Full Marks= (Unit Test: 14 + Attendance: 06) = 20 (Twenty)

Pass Marks = 08 (Eight)

UNIT TEST

Maximum Marks:

Course with only Theory papers = 20 (twenty)

Course with both Theory & Practical papers = 14 (Fourteen)

There shall be two Unit Tests per semester for each and every Theory paper excluding Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC) and skill Enhancement Course (SEC) and dates of such tests shall be notified by the Controller of Examination. The highest mark scored by a student out of two Unit Tests shall be awarded to the student as the marks under Unit Test of CCA.

There shall be NO Unit Test for practical papers.

Unit Test may preferably be conducted during non-allotted class so that total number of question papers and evaluation of answer scripts of Unit Test shall be done by teachers of the concerned department. Marks obtained by the students be announced within one week of the Unit Test. If demanded, answer scripts of Unit Test be shown to students.

The HOD shall maintain a register recording the marks secured by students in all the Unit Test in each paper under his/her department.

A student who failed to secure minimum pass in CCA of a paper shall NOT be allowed to appear in the concerned paper of the End Semester Examination (ESE). However, such a student may appear in the subsequent similar semester (odd/even) as an Arrear paper with the condition that:

- 1. He/she will appear in the Unit Test/s of the concerned paper along with the regular students and to secure minimum pass marks.
- 2. He/she will appear with such number of Arrear Papers in similar ESE (odd/even) as laid down under point No. 13

CLASS ATTENDANCE

Each student shall have to attend a minimum of 75% Lectures/Tutorials/Practical classes in each paper of all the course as per the recommended Course structure of the concerned programme of study.

Class Attendance shall be calculated base on actual number of classes held during semester in each course/paper. Number of decimal be reunded off to next higher number (e.g. 74.01% be rounded off to 75%).

Only the student with 75% and above of attendance in any paper (Excluding "Additional GE Course, if any) of the concerned semester shall be allowed to appear in the concerned paper in that End Semester Examination (ESE).

However, a student with less than 75% of attendance in any paper (excluding any paper of Additional GE Course, if any) of the concerned semester shall NOT be allowed to appear in the concerned paper of the ESE but may be allowed to get admission in the immediate next higher semester. However, such a student may appear in the subsequent similar ESE (odd/even) in the concerned paper as an Arrear paper and, marks to be awarded under CCA for each paper shall be the marks previously secured by the student in the concerned paper.

Note: Marks under CCA shall be carried forward as per above Role only if the student secure pass in the Unit Test of the concerned paper else he/she shall have to appear in Unit Test in the concerned paper along with the regular student in the concerned semester to secure minimum pass marks allotted for CCA of the concerned paper.

Period/days during which students attend to represent the National/State/University/College in the different Regional, National and International Events of sports/Culture/NCC/NSS etc. may be treated as class attendance for the actual number of days subject to a maximum of 20 (twenty days).

There is a provision condonation of attendance to be accorded by the Principal of the college for the students who have put up the attendance between 64% to 74% due to purely on medical grounds on production of Medical Certificate from the Component Authority. Prayer for such condonation shall be routed through the Head of the department.

Attendance shall be assessed under Continuous and Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) and the marks be awarded.

The HoD shall maintain a register recording the students the student's monthly attendance percentage for such paper under his/her department. Cumulative monthly students' class attendance may be recorded and Distribution of marks for Class Attendance:
